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# Ringwood as a regional centre

- Ringwood
  - 27 kilometres east of Melbourne
  - Transit City
    - Junction of the Belgrave/Lilydale lines
  - Issues
    - Rail corridor
    - Ringwood Station




### Rail capacity

- Ringwood
  - 42 minutes to CBD
  - 35 minutes in peak times
- Two tracks Ringwood to Box Hill
- Capacity issues
  - Third track would allow express services through to Ringwood
  - Allow an additional 23 trains to terminate at Ringwood during peak times

- Maroondah Highway boulevard treatment
  - Pedestrian improvements
  - 40km speed limits and lane reductions
  - Accessible and safe urban centre

\$16 million per annum in Gross State Product

### **Today's reality**

- Funding for Ringwood Station was not announced in the recent State Budget
  - At least \$600 million of investment at stake
  - Current station fails accessibility requirements
  - Perceived to be unsafe
  - Catalyst for further improvements
